A request for an informal conference alone is not an appeal of a citation, and any unresolved issues discussed at an informal conference will not be forwarded for appeal unless there is a timely request for hearing filed. If you do not request a hearing within the required time frame, this citation will become a final order that is not subject to review by any agency or court.

- 1. Employees do not receive adequate training in rescue. There is a rescue "kit" on some sites but the employees do no know what's in the kit or how to use it. Work sites are often in remote locations. There has never been any practice sessions for rescue.
- 2. Portable fire extinguishers taken to job sites have no tags and don't get checked on a monthly basis.
- 3. Cords used on job sites are damaged, with conductors showing through the cut sheathing.

Background Information: This is the second inspection related to complaint #209055706. The site was evaluated for the complaint items listed. The SSCO did not expand the scope at this site. The SSCO needed an additional site to evaluate and additional interviews to determine the validity of the complaint items.

Inspection Activities/Observations: The SSCO conducted the opening conference with the Foreman and conducted the walk around. Interviews were conducted with several employees focused on the complaint items. These information gathered during these interviews will be used along with previous interviews and evidence obtained during the first inspection to support several alleged violations cited under Opt. # B9820-057-13. Three closing attempts were made. A closing letter will be sent.
